## The Next Phase: Budget 2011

### 1: Supporting Job Creation

- Extending the Accelerated Capital Cost Allowance
- Enhancing programs to retain employees
- Hiring Credit for small business
- Providing help for unemployed workers
- Legislating permanent gas tax funding for municipalities.

### 2: Support for Families & Communities

- New Children's Arts Tax Credit
- Family Caregiver Tax Credit
- Extending ecoEnergy Retrofit—Homes Program
- Student Loan forgiveness for Doctors and nurses practicing in rural or remote locations
- Programs for Youth Crime Prevention
- Strengthening Canada's Infrastructure

- Enhancing Guaranteed Income Supplement up to \$600 for single and \$840 for couples
- Eliminating mandatory retirement age

- Returning to a Balanced Budget by 2015-16

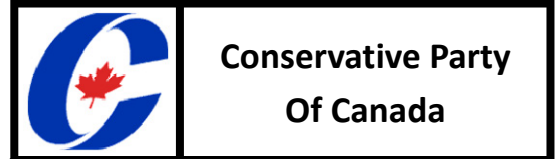

## Brent is Tough On Crime

The Justice and Human Rights Committee have:

- Ended Federal Benefits such as Old Age Security for Federal Prisoners (Clifford Olsen)
- Ended Pardon Eligibility for Sexual Predators (Karla Homolka)
- Ended 2 for 1 Credit for time served in pre-trial custody
- Established minimum mandatory sentences for White Collar Fraudsters

Twenty-two of the Government's important crime bills such as ending early parole and mandatory minimum sentences for sexual predators and drug traffickers died on the Order Paper with the dissolution of Parliament.
